PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Road Project

Progress remains slow, with the delays caused by the Environment Protection and Biosecurity (EPBC) Act and the acquisition of Airport land on the corner of Pittwater Road. These issues are being dealt with by the Department of State Growth and are outside of our control.

Work is continuing on the development of a report from Jeff Blunden (Golf Business Advisory Services) on levels of compensation for the Club including the Pro-shop as a result of the Road Project.

Course Equipment

With the recent acquisition of the 2 brand new roughs mowers, we have successfully renewed our complete fleet of our major on course equipment from the dilapidated gear that we had in 2015 we now have: Greens Mowers, Surround mowers, Roughs mowers, tractor, tip truck and greens roller that are safe and reliable. For those members that can remember back, this is a huge step forward.

Course Superintendent

Following Dan Gilligan's decision to retire we are in the process of filling the role. The recent advertisements attracted a strong field and are close to making an appointment. I anticipate an announcement next week.

Members Forum

A members Forum will be scheduled in early September. The main focus will be on the Course Management plan. Additionally, members will have the opportunity to discuss the Road Project and any other issues. More on this shortly.

Unfortunately, in the State final played over 36 holes at Mowbray Golf Club, our Div 1 team went down to Prospect Vale Golf Club 4-3 - with the result literally down to the final putt. Well done to those who travelled up.



The club's mixed foursomes championship was held in April with 14 pairs competing. Congratulations to Sharon Rooney and Myles Chapman for their gross win, and Helen and Michael Healy for their nett win. There have been discussions in the background looking at ways to increase participation in this event going forward with the hope of increasing the field and creating a great day for all involved.

Tasmania Golf Club also hosted the Australian Junior Amateur Championships in early April 2023. We had a full field of athletes from all over Australia, as well as a scattering of international golfers. Congratulations to Ann Jang (NSW Golf Club) and Zack Swanwick (Napier Golf Club, NZ) for their victories. Congratulations to our members MacKenzie Thomas and Eli Monaghan on their fine performances. A big thank you to all those who provided their time and knowledge to the event.

More recently, congratulations to Nicola Chapman and Paulla Read for winning the Division 1 Scratch Foursomes against Royal Hobart GC, held at Claremont GC. Well done ladies.

Off the course, there has been just as much happening. There has been a working group setup to go through the course masterplan design by Ben Davey. This group consisted of Andrew Phillips, Graeme Corney, Peter Volker,



Nicola Chapman, John Milbourne and myself. The majority of conversations so far are about developing core principles for the design around aesthetics, cost of implementation, cost of ongoing maintenance and playability. These discussions have been positive and have been relayed back and forth to the course architect for consideration. One area of interest is between the 15th and 16th holes, and how we can use this to better the hole.




One thought is to have an area of "broken ground" where balls are easily found, but not specifically easily played. This type of area can also be considered between 1,18,16 hole complex instead of (or in conjunction with) currently planned fairway bunker complexes. We are looking at turning the area between 15 and 16 into "broken ground" shortly as a trial to look at all 4 philosophies of aesthetics, cost to implement, cost to maintain and playability.

In conjunction with the above, we have also looked at commencing other work surrounding the course redesign that can be done in-house whilst waiting on the SETS project. The 2 most visually obvious ones at present are

- the all weather synthetic strip on the practice range, this will provide members with benefits now, when the driving range is being redeveloped and down the track and
- the and the redoing of the now 10th tee with a laser level and instant turf.
 The renovation of this tee is most exciting to me personally, as if successful enables us to rebuild tees across the course in a manner that fits with the future of the club whilst also addressing a major issue raised by members in previous surveys about the condition of the tee beds.

Another major change at TGC is the re-routing of the course in conjunction

with the redesign.
As you would be aware on 1 st July the course was re-routed with the 9s flipping along with the re-route of the former back 9 holes (10,11,12->15,16,17->13, 14->18). This is designed to break up the period of up



and back holes, as well as removing 3 consecutive par 5 holes for the women. The next step is construction of the forward tees on the now 7th and already constructed forward tee on the 18th.



This will see these holes as par 4s for the women and reduce the par to 72 as is the case for men – resulting in the ability to "de-gendify" tees and simply have front, middle, back, tips. This will take a little extra time and effort specifically around having the course rerated by Golf Australia for handicapping purposes. Following the new routing and Saturday single tee starts at 8 minute intervals we continue to monitor pace of play issues and are reviewing arrangements as we get towards more daylight hours. This will include optimum time intervals and 2 tee starts. The split tees will return in August at 10-minute intervals with the likelihood of reverting to single tee starts for 3 months every year (May, June July) to allow maximum members the ability to play Saturday competitions.

Finally, to finish on a negative, a little gripe about course pride and maintaining our course. During the AJA we had a lot of unrepaired divots to our dismay. Our members were fantastic in repairing these in the weeks following to the stage where the course showed no evidence of the event being held (apart from tee beds...). However, recently, the divot problem is back, and we can't blame AJA or cruise ships – this is a member problem. The new signs shown in the previous newsletter are due to arrive in the upcoming weeks, but remember....

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Clubhouse and Surrounds

Parking spots adjacent to the front door of the clubhouse are reserved for senior (>70 years) hospitality customers' usage whilst they are in the restaurant. Members who do not satisfy the above criteria are advised NOT to park in these spots when playing golf.

Work has recently been completed in the carpark to repair a 90 sqm section of the carpark which had broken down.

Welcome to Phil Heaton our new part-time Maintenance Officer. The role will focus on clubhouse presentation and ensuring our utilities are operating properly. Another priority will be to manage a major clean-up and rubbish collection involving both the clubhouse and rubbish piles/collections adjacent to the entry road repair

A quote has been accepted for roof work to fix buggy room leaks and front gutter leaks. This repair has taken place during the first weekend of July. The camera security system is currently being examined with a view to upgrading the system to provide greater coverage including 1st and 10th tees.

The fire detection/monitoring system is currently being examined with a view to adding smoke detectors. Many thanks to Leigh Finlayson for his ongoing assistance.

Many of the clubhouse lights are very old fluoro tubes which are expensive to replace and "run" versus LED lights. The halogen spotlights are also expensive to "run". A project is underway to consider and cost transition to 100% LED.

An assessment of the extremely deteriorated clubhouse roof window frames is also underway to identify an appropriate resolution.



Annual General Meeting

The meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, 24th October 2023.

Reports from the Board will be tabled including important updates on the state of our finances, the South East Traffic Solution/highway project and the Course Master Plan.

As per our constitution 3 of the Board positions and the President's role will be open. This means that current incumbents may re-nominate and/or new nominations invited. Nominations will open in early August.

Pedestrian Safety

For safety reasons and for courtesy of others, members are reminded that carts are not to be driven through the covered way between the pro-shop and clubhouse doors.

Please ensure that carts are driven around the putting green outside the flag poles when moving to the 1st tee and from the 9th green to the 10th tee.

TREASURER'S REPORT

A "draft" Profit and Loss report for the year just finished, FY2023 has been completed. All revenues showed an increase over the prior year: Green Fees were up 36%; bar trading up 17%; and kitchen up 20%. Despite extra expenses for improvements and repairs and maintenance around the clubhouse and for the purchase of some course equipment, we have come in ahead of budget. Savings included water and interest costs.

Purchases through the year included some second-hand equipment: a tipper truck, Toro workman, and greens roller as well as two new roughs' mowers and a new greens roller. Given the increasing demand for motorised carts, we also purchased four more of these.

With the current level of inflation and significant cost increases, the Club needs to be vigilant and look at ways we can maintain our strong financial position. While our cash position fluctuates, we currently have \$250,000 in the bank earning interest.
